As one of the newly-elected Vice Presidents at the recent ESF AGM in Wroclaw, I would like to introduce myself to the European Masters Squash community. I have been appointed as the Chairman of the Masters Committee and realise that I have a very 'tough act to follow' in replacing Pavel Sladeczek who has done a great job over the past 4 years.

I grew up living in Dublin as a member of a 'squash family'. My Dad, Mossie Collins, was both a keen squash player and coach who only retired from Irish Masters team competitions 2 years ago aged 80. My two brothers, Maurice and Chris Collins, both played on Irish Men's teams for many years.

I also played on Irish junior and university squash teams, though have to admit that I've

had the best fun and enjoyment playing on Irish Masters Home International teams from the age of 35 (and upwards!).

I have been Hon. Secretary of Irish Squash since 2015 and managed the Irish Women's team between 2014 and 2017.

The Masters Committee have overseen a significant expansion in the number of Masters tournaments in Europe over the past 4 years - there are now 14 events per year. Our aim is to ensure that the quality of these tournaments is as high as possible. The committee work extremely hard in order to support the local organisers of each event (before, during and after tournaments) and the feedback from players



through our survey is very important to us.

I look forward to working with the Masters Committee over the next couple of years and also to meeting more of the players on the European masters circuit (both on and off the court).

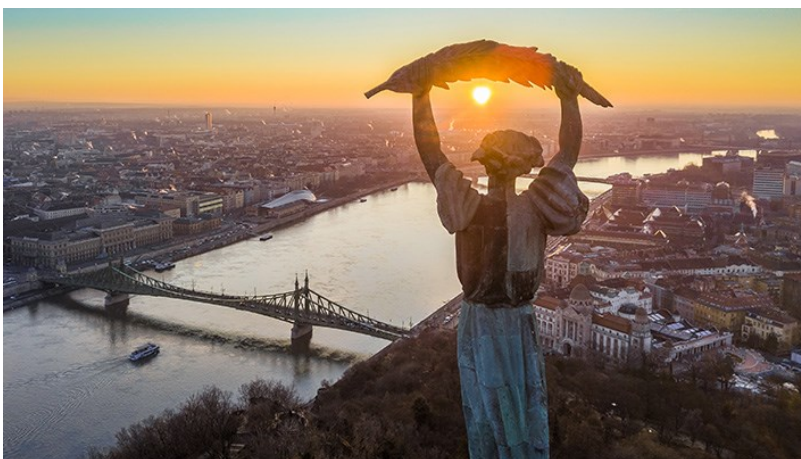

April, sunny weather and 27 °C. Who is thinking about umbrella drinks, swimming pool, Mallorca and reading book on the beach would be badly mistaken. These super weather conditions were ordered by the Czech crew organising the Czech Squash Open Grand Prix tournament held in Prague on April 20.-22. Since the weather in Europe was at that time mostly cold and rainy, all players and their relatives who made it to Prague were already winners.

But players came for more than nice weather. They came for their portion of emotions, squash rallies, sweating, cursing, fair play, meeting old friend as well as getting to know new opponents, some also for bit of cheating and not sporty behaving on and off court, discussion with the referees and selling some of the acting talent they learned down the road. All these explosives wrapped and delivered in 800 matches during 3 days.

Only 3 players seeded as number 1 confirmed their seeding and won their titles so Prague was full of big battles and surprises, not to mention 3 categories won by unseeded players.

It starts to be a nice tradition that Prague hosts not only the biggest tournament from the ESF masters circuit but also attracts really good players. This year played in Prague 7 medalists from the last EMIC (2017) spread in different categories so players really had a chance to compare their skills with the best.

But ESF masters tournaments are not only about squash but are very much about meeting people, enjoying new destinations and attractions. Organisers prepared for Friday night boat trip on Vltava River overlooking some of the Prague top historical sites; Saturday night was traditionally occupied by the players' party.

If good weather, entertaining squash, brand tournament t-shirts, party or boat trip wouldn't still be enough to satisfy the players, refreshment available throughout the tournament for free, especially the tasty cakes baked by Denisa had to please even the last doubter.

Can Prague offer more or anything new in next years?

The tournament director Sonja Schwarzer together with her team (Renata Nejtkova, Denisa Linhartova and Heiko Schwarzer) is already preparing some important changes for next tournament including new official hotel closer to the venue, waiting list for players who didn't meet the deadline but will get a chance to play by replacing late cancellation and some other organisational changes. 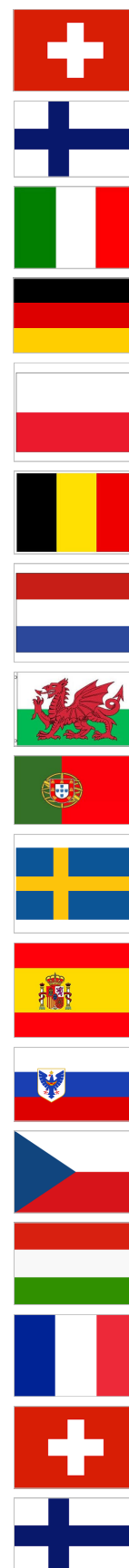
